Mr Mark Kinge (27), of Buffins Road, Odiham, braked sharply after coming across a row of parked cars and a BMW waiting on the other side of the road

But he lost control of his 750cc Yamaha, hit a Range Rover and catapulted across the road.

Mr Kinge died of multiple injuries following the accident in Deptford Road, Greywell, on October 24.
